

## ACVIM Forum On Demand – Continuing Education Information

### Veterinarians

Veterinarians are able to earn up to 79 hours of Continuing Education (CE) credits.

### Technicians

### Earning CE

Earn CE credits by viewing recorded sessions and 15-minute ePoster content. Each session will have a CE quiz for you to take and successfully pass. Each CE quiz is comprised of at least 5 questions and requires a score of 70% or higher to pass. You will receive 3 attempts to successfully complete each quiz. Upon successful completion, your account automatically tracks all earned CE credit hours to include on your CE Certificate.

### RACE-approval

The 2020 ACVIM Forum On Demand program 572 is pending approval by the AAVSB RACE to offer CE credits being available to one veterinarian or technician. This program has been submitted for up to 79.25 hours of continuing education credit in jurisdictions that recognize RACE-approval.

This RACE-approval is for the subject matter categories of:
